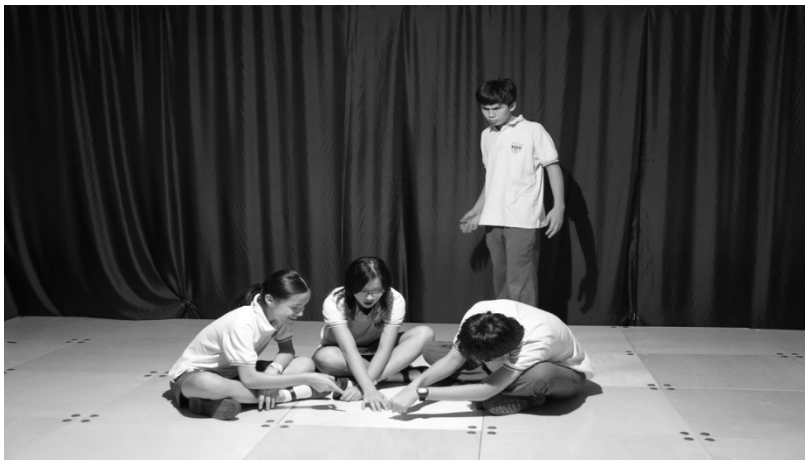




A good way to explain a freeze frame (also known as *still image*) is that it is like pressing the pause button on a remote control, taking a photo or making a statue. In drama, the images can be made quickly without discussion – or they can be planned and rehearsed. We use freeze frames as a way

of communicating ideas or telling a story. They can be used to represent people or objects and even abstract ideas like emotions or atmospheres. When we perform a freeze frame, we must not move or speak! Here is an example of a freeze frame, can you guess what is going on?
